ELIGIBILITY & PARTICIPANT ROLES

We welcome eligible Scouts and adult members from across Australia to join our Contingent. Each participant category has different age ranges, responsibilities, and program options:

01

Youth Participants (Core and Explore)

Eligibility: Must be born on or before 30 July 2013 (to be at least 14 years old by the start of the Jamboree), and born after 12 August 2009 (to remain under 18 throughout)

- Must be an invested Scout or Venturer Scout
- Must have completed Outdoor Adventure Skills Camping Stage 4 prior to departure
- Due to the expansive nature of the site, a good level of fitness is required – participants are expected to walk over 10 km per day
- Must be recommended as suitable to attend by their Scout/ Venturer Leader and Group Leader, and endorsed by their Branch Headquarters

Youth Participants (Adventure and Ultimate)

Eligibility: Must be born on or before 30 July 2013 (to be at least 14 years old by the start of the Jamboree), and born after 16 August 2009 (to remain under 18 throughout)

- Must be an invested Scout or Venturer Scout
- Must have completed Outdoor Adventure Skills Camping Stage 4 prior to departure
- Due to the expansive nature of the site, a good level of fitness is required – participants are expected to walk over 10 km per day
- Must be recommended as suitable to attend by their Scout/ Venturer Leader and Group Leader, and endorsed by their Branch Headquarters

Unit Leaders / Assistant Unit Leaders

Eligibility: Must be a registered member of your Branch as a Rover, Youth Program Leader or Program Support Leader.

- Must be recommended as suitable to attend by your Group Leader or next appropriate Commissioner, your Region/District Commissioner, and endorsed by your Branch Headquarters
- Must be 21 years of age by 23 July 2027
- A good level of fitness is required Leaders are expected to walk over 10 km per day
- Must have demonstrated experience with the Scout or Venturer age group, and ideally previous Jamboree/Venture experience
- Leaders will be selected based on their experience, ability to work with youth, and ability to run a successful Jamboree Unit
- Unit Leaders will be individually selected from the Assistant Unit Leader pool

International Service Team (IST)

Eligibility: Must be a registered member of your Branch as a Rover or Youth Program or Program Support Leader. (Other members may be considered by the Contingent Leader to meet specific needs of the Contingent where these are not met by Youth Program Leaders or Program Support Leaders. Additionally, where particular skills and experience are required by the Contingent or event, other membership categories may be considered by the Contingent Leader, in conjunction with the International Commissioner.)

- Must be 18 years of age by 25 July 2027
- Must be recommended as suitable to attend by your Group Leader or next appropriate Commissioner, your Region/District Commissioner, and endorsed by your Branch Headquarters
- A good level of fitness is required IST members are expected to walk up to 10 km per day
- Members with qualifications in particular Adventurous Activities will be highly regarded by the Jamboree Committee
- Roles are assigned by the Jamboree Organising Committee and subject to approval – applicants approved by the Australian Contingent may not necessarily be approved by the Host Jamboree if a suitable role is not found
- IST will be selected to meet quotas prescribed by the Jamboree Organising Committee

To get ready for the adventure of a lifetime, all Contingent members must take part in a mandatory Meet Camp in early 2026.

These in-person weekends are a key part of the Contingent experience and are designed to prepare you for international travel, build your Patrol or IST team connections, and ensure everyone is ready to thrive at the Jamboree.

Why It Matters

Meet Camps help set expectations, resolve issues early, and ensure every participant youth and adult, is ready to represent Australia safely and positively.

They're also a key milestone in your journey. After attending your Meet Camp, you'll receive your final confirmation of attendance to Poland 2027.

Please note: Attendance is mandatory. Non-attendance may affect your place in the Contingent.

EXPLORE PRE-TOUR

Kraków, Poland • 24–29 July 2027

Included in Explore and Ultimate Packages

Before the Jamboree begins, join a 5-night experience based in the historic city of Kraków. You'll have time to settle in, connect with your Unit, and explore southern Poland through the activity stream of your choice.

Choose Your Steam

Participants will preference one of three activity streams to match their interests. Each stream runs for four full days before travelling to the Jamboree site on 29 July.

- Swim at Zakrzowek Park + visit Wawel Castle
- Energylandia theme park
- Trail of the Eagles' Nest cycle OR adventure activity
- Hike in Tatra National Park OR raft the Dunajec River

- Zakopane + thermal spa + cheese tasting
- Salt mine visit + pierogi cooking class

HYBRID

- A mix of adventure and cultural highlights
- Includes Energylandia, Zakopane, and Tatra hike

You'll stay in dorm-style youth lodges, with all meals included. Transport around Kraków is by coach and tram. As Poland's former royal capital, Kraków is home to Europe's oldest universities and a UNESCO-listed Old Town, the perfect base to explore, meet your Unit, and get ready for the adventure ahead.





CORE JAMBOREE EXPERIENCE

The World Scout Jamboree is a once-in-a-lifetime event, a global celebration of Scouting that brings together tens of thousands of young people from over 170 countries.

Key Details







What to Expect

- Camp with 40,000 Scouts from across the globe
- Patrol-based program delivery and making international friendships.
- Activities include water sports, hiking, pioneering, sustainability labs, global development village, culture day, exhibitions, and live shows
- All meals, tenting, and base support provided

Australian Contingent Units will camp together and be supported by their assigned Unit Leaders and the on-site Contingent Management Team (CMT). Each Unit is made up of 36 youth participants and 4 adult Leaders, organised into 4 patrols of 9 youth and one Leader. International Service Team participants will be accommodated in a separate area.

A World Scout Jamboree is a challenging event. It is not like an Australian major event. It's important to understand what to expect so you're prepared:

- **Heat and weather:** Poland in summer can be hot, with long days in the sun with limited shade. Be ready for outdoor living in all conditions.
- **Distances:** The site is vast. Participants will often walk more than 10 km a day, sometimes with baggage. A suitable level of fitness is required.
- **Food:** Meals are not the same as home. Choice is minimal, dietaries can be difficult, and mistakes happen. You must be prepared to eat what is provided.
- Changing timelines: With an event of this scale, plans shift. Knowing things won't always go to plan is important.
- Language and culture: You'll meet Scouts from all over the world. English is common, but not universal. Patience is essential.

All participants must be prepared and resilient for these realities.







Prague, Czech Republic • 9-14 August 2027

After the Jamboree ends, keep the adventure going with a 5-night experience in the vibrant city of Prague. This is your chance to relax, celebrate everything you've achieved, and wrap up your time in Europe with something unforgettable.

Fresh off the Jamboree and not ready to head home just yet? Join your new mates on an epic city-hopping adventure through Germany and the Netherlands. The Escape Tour is six days of train rides, street food, bucket-list sights, and laid-back vibes, the perfect way to wind down and celebrate after an intense two weeks of service and Scouting.

You'll explore buzzing capitals and hidden gems, cruise canals, climb towers, and cycle cobbled lanes. Think less rigid itinerary, more "see the city, make memories, crash in a hostel, and do it all again tomorrow."

TRAVEL & BAGGAGE

The Contingent will arrange group flights departing from each capital city to Europe. All Youth Participants and Unit Leaders must travel with the Contingent.



Flights & Transfers

- Departing Australia 23-24 July 2027
- Returning to Australia 15-16 August 2027
- All internal transfers (coach, rail, air) are included
- Baggage allowance is economy class: 1 x 23 kg checked, 1 x 7 kg carry-on



Self-Organised Travel

Youth Participants and Unit Leaders:

- All travel for Youth Participants and Unit Leaders is arranged by the Australian Contingent and included in the Jamboree fee.
- In very limited circumstances, and only at the discretion of the Contingent Leader, an exception may be granted for self-organised travel.
- If approved, strict conditions apply. Contact us for more infomation.



IST Members:

- May choose either Contingent-organised travel or self-organised travel.
- If choosing self-organised, you must meet the Contingent at a designated location in Poland at a non-negotiable time.

Passports must be valid until at least 16 February 2028 to meet travel requirements.

FAQS

Q	Will I be in a Unit with people I know?
A	We try to place at least one familiar person with each participant, but the Jamboree is about meeting new people too! Units are formed based on age, gender, state, and experience balance.
Q	What if I have accessibility or medical needs?
A	We welcome all eligible members to apply, however it is important to note this is a large-scale event with limits to what can be accommodated by the Jamboree. Please include any additional needs in your application so we can work with you to plan a safe and supported experience, or discuss other opportunities if required.
Q	Will there be a kit sizing guide?
A	Yes, you'll be able to enter your sizes for every item before we finalise production. Sizing charts and try-on opportunities may be provided.
Q	Can I go on the tour with my child as a parent or guardian?
A	Only registered Adult Leaders or Rovers over 18 who meet eligibility criteria may attend.
Q	How will you support dietary or cultural needs?
A	We work with our caterers to accommodate dietary and cultural needs wherever possible. Meals will be different to home and choice is limited, so some flexibility is required. You'll be asked to provide this information during your application.
Q	Can I fundraise as a group with other applicants?
A	Absolutely! You can work together locally to host fundraising events. Just be sure to follow Scouts Australia's fundraising guidelines and always seek permission where required.
Q	What happens if I need to withdraw after being accepted?
A	If you need to withdraw after being accepted, refunds are based on when we receive your notification: • On or before 30 October 2026: Full refund • 31 October 2026 – 31 March 2027: Recoverable fees plus \$500 admin fee. • On or after 1 April 2027: No refund Refunds are calculated based on costs already committed by the Contingent at each stage.
Q	What if the Jamboree is cancelled or postponed?
A	We will communicate any changes as soon as possible. Our priority is to recover and refund any costs that haven't already been committed, but some expenses may be non-refundable.
